Regulatory Rules in the MRB Report

Problem:

In an international context, Regulatory Rules (in the MRB) lead to considerable confusion when deciding applicability (e.g. US DOT Pressure Vessel Hydrostatic Testing, CAA Escape Slide Sampling). In most cases, the resulting tasks are not

true derivatives of MSG methodology.

Recommendation: MRB tasks should be derived from MSG methodology. Tasks derived wholly from

"external" regulatory rules should be separately listed, possibly in "Regulatory

Appendix".

## **IMRBPB** Position:

The MRB Report should only contain tasks arising from the MRB Process. National differences for MSG-3 derived tasks should be identified FAA AC 121-22A and JAA A&GM Chapter 16 already contain appropriate guidance.
