Context:

GAME Composites Ltd, based in the United Kingdom, has made an application, dated February 7th 2019 to EASA for the transfer of Type Certificate (TC) EASA.A.610 to GAME Composites LLC, based in the United States of America.

In accordance with section 5.2.1.5, 5.2.1.6, of the revision 6 of the TIP (Technical Implementation Procedures for airworthiness and environmental certification between the Federal Aviation Administration of the United States of America and the European Aviation Safety Agency of the European Union), the FAA has confirmed that GAME Composites LLC is able to perform the responsibilities required of Type Certificate holder and has issued a Type Certificate A00073CE rev.1 (and corresponding TCDS A00073CE rev.1).

In accordance with the EASA procedures for transfers of Certificates, GAME Composites LLC has requested the transfer of the certificate EASA.A.610 and has agreed to take on the responsibilities and obligations as new Type Certificate Holder in accordance with 21A.44. After transfer the Type Certificate and the Type Certificate Data sheet are numbered as EASA.IM.A.610.

In accordance with TIP 6, the FAA has accepted to take over the responsibility of the State of Design.

As a consequence, EASA has accepted the transfer and re-issued the Type Certificate.

No Airworthiness Directives (ADs) related to this Type Certificate have been issued.
