Background: On 26 June 2017 the Type Certificate Holder has requested to surrender the

aforementioned TC to EASA.

In accordance with the applicable EASA administrative procedures, the proposal to surrender the EASA grandfathered Type Certificate A-220 was published on the EASA website for public consultation under EASA Certification Information No. 2017-11, dated 30 June 2017.

There were no comments received during the public consultation and EASA decided to accept the surrender of the aforementioned certificate.

EASA has notified the Type Certificate Holder of its acceptance of the surrender of EASA grandfathered Type Certificate A-220 on 25.08.2017.

From that date, the EASA grandfathered Type Certificate A-220 is invalid, pursuant to Article 21.A.51(a)2. of the Annex (Part 21) to Commission Regulation (EU) No. 748/2012.
