EASA will not issue an invoice for the registration fee, but upon request a receipt as proof of payment can be sent by e-mail.

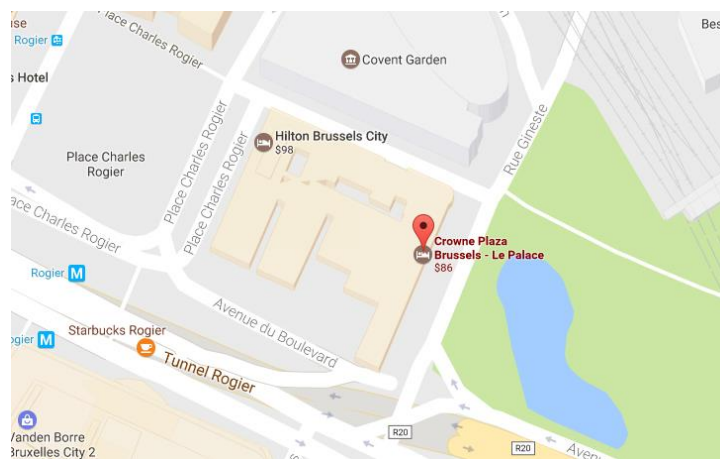

*The Gala Dinner on the first day of the Conference is included in the Conference Package.*

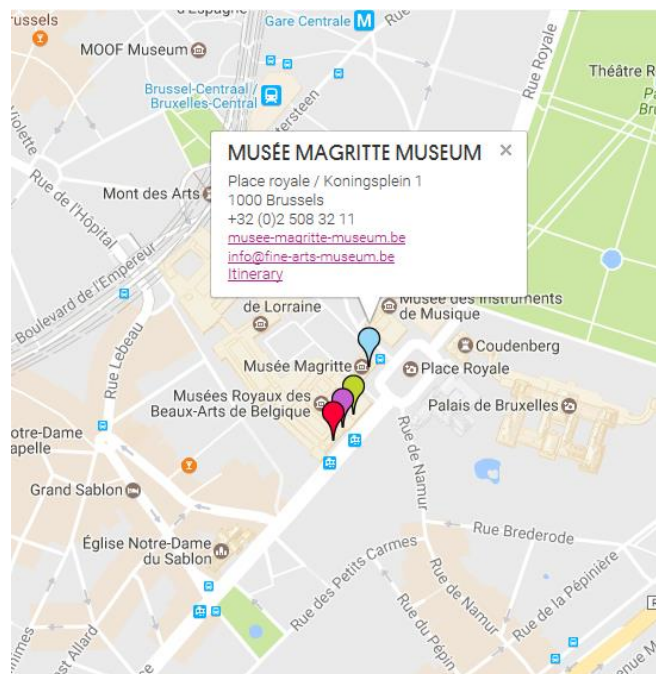
## Visit to Magritte Museum followed by Gala Dinner hosted by EASA

Brussels (French: Bruxelles, Dutch: Brussel) is the capital city of Belgium. As headquarters of many European institutions, Brussels might also be considered something of a capital for the European Union. Being at the crossroads of cultures (the Germanic in the North and the Romance in the South) and playing an important role in Europe, Brussels fits the definition of the archetypal "melting pot", but still retains its own unique character. The population of the city of Brussels is 1 million and the population of Brussels metropolitan area is just over 2 million.
