**Amendment 7 to the Acceptable Means of Compliance and Guidance Material  
to Commission Regulation (EU) No 139/2014**

**‘AMC and GM to Authority, Organisation and Operations Requirements  
for Aerodromes — Issue 1, Amendment 7’**

**‘Aeronautical information publication — AMC & GM to the Aerodromes rules’**

THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AVIATION SAFETY AGENCY (EASA),

Having regard to Regulation (EU) 2018/1139<sup>1</sup>, and in particular Article 104(3)(a) thereof,

Having regard to Commission Regulation (EU) No 139/2014<sup>2</sup>, and in particular point ADR.AR.A.015 of Annex II thereto,

Whereas:

- (1) EASA shall, pursuant to Article 76(3) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139, issue certification specifications (CSs) and other detailed specifications (DSs), acceptable means of compliance (AMC), and guidance material (GM) for the application of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 and of the delegated and implementing acts adopted on the basis thereof.
- (2) Acceptable means of compliance (AMC) are non-binding standards issued by EASA, which are used by persons and organisations to show compliance with Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 and the delegated and implementing acts adopted on the basis thereof, or with CSs and DSs.
- (3) Guidance material (GM) is non-binding material issued by EASA, which helps to illustrate the meaning of delegated or implementing acts or CSs and DSs, and which is used to support the

interpretation of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139, the delegated and implementing acts adopted on the basis thereof, and of CSs and DSs.

- (4) With Decision 2014/012/R of 27 February 2014, the Executive Director issued Acceptable Means of Compliance and Guidance Material to Regulation (EU) No 139/2014.
- (5) EASA shall, pursuant to Article 4(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139, reflect the state of the art and the best practices in the field of aviation and update its Decisions, taking into account worldwide aviation experience and scientific and technical progress in the respective fields.
- (6) Implementing Regulation (EU) 2017/373 laying down common requirements for service providers and the oversight in ATM/ANS services and other ATM network functions was amended by Implementing Regulation (EU) 2022/938 of 26 July 2022<sup>3</sup> regarding amongst others, the instructions for the completion of SNOWTAM.
- (7) In this context, EASA has determined the need to issue guidance material to facilitate the implementation of the amended requirements.
- (8) EASA, pursuant to Article 115(1)(c) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1139 and Article 15 'Special rulemaking procedure: direct publication' of the, at the time applicable, EASA Rulemaking Procedure<sup>4</sup>, consulted the affected stakeholders as well as its Advisory Bodies (ABs) on the content of this Decision and considered the comments received,

HAS DECIDED:

### **Article 1**

The Annex to Decision 2014/012/R of the Executive Director of the Agency of 27 February 2014 is amended as laid down in the Annex to this Decision.

### **Article 2**

This Decision shall enter into force on the day following that of its publication in the Official Publication of EASA.
