## 1. Subject:

Flights related to design and production activities

# 2. Problem/statement of the issue and justification; reason for regulatory evolution (regulatory tasks):

Flights related to design and production activities are understood as flights related to the introduction of new aircraft types or changes to the aircraft type design. They are carried out by design and/or production organisations with or without a design organisation approval (DOA) and/or a production organisation approval (POA). Such flights are often referred to as 'manufacturer flights', and include, but are not limited to, test flights, demonstration flights, customer acceptance flights and ferry flights.

Due to the specific nature of flights related to design and production activities, these flights are presently excluded from the Agency's Opinions on air operations (Opinions 04/2011, 01/2012 and 02/2012). Instead, at present these flights are carried out in compliance with national provisions while harmonised operational requirements should be provided in the area of air operations.

This gap needs to be closed. The Agency started doing so by establishing Implementing Rules, Acceptable Means of Compliance (AMC) and Guidance Material (GM) for flight testing by amending Part-21 and the associated AMC and GM<sup>12</sup>. However, in the course of the rulemaking activity related to this ToR the operational requirements concerning flight testing will also be reviewed and, if necessary, amended.

Commercial or non-commercial flights carried out by these organisations for the purpose of:

- transporting passengers, cargo or mail;
- pleasure; or
- carrying out a specialised task where the aircraft is either flown very low, carrying out unusual manoeuvres, lifting or towing external loads/goods or where persons enter or leave the aircraft during flight

are addressed by the operational requirements published with the Agency's Opinion 04/2011, 01/2012 and 02/2012.

It should be mentioned that maintenance check flights are not included in this task. They are covered by separate rulemaking tasks of the Agency, namely RMT.0393 (MDM.097(a)) and RMT.0394 (MDM.097(b)) and are envisaged to be finalised in 2013.

Any 'non-revenue' flight conducted by operators not involved in design and production activities will be addressed in the Agency's future rulemaking tasks RMT.0352 (OPS.075a) and RMT.0353 (OPS.075).

No preliminary Regulatory Impact Assessment (Pre-RIA) was required to determine whether the tasks RMT.0348 (OPS.073(a)) and RMT.0349 (OPS.073(b)) should become part of the Agency's Rulemaking Programme. The reason is that the driving force behind these rulemaking tasks is the Basic Regulation itself. It establishes an obligation to carry out these rulemaking tasks and the timelines for delivering them.

The objective of these rulemaking tasks is to establish or to amend, as appropriate, Implementing Rules and associated AMC and GM on operational requirements for flights related to design and production activities. The final objective is to establish a harmonised safety level and conditions under which these flights are to be conducted.

### 4. Specific tasks and interface issues (deliverables):

Review and amend the Commission Regulation establishing the Implementing Rules for air operations (e.g. DEF, Part-ORO and Part-SPO) and the associated AMC and GM. In addition, concerning operational requirements, it is envisaged to review and, if needed, to amend Regulation (EC) No 1702/2003 (Part-21) and the associated AMC and GM.

## 5. Working methods (in addition to the applicable Agency's procedures):
